February Stated Session

- Officers of the Corporation are Claire Grant and Kim Scott, who were approved by Session.
- Kara Davis and Scott Cruce moved to approve the 2023 PM&B Distributions. Motion was approved. Distribution sheet is attached.
- Windows in the administrative part of the church building will be replaced, at a cost of \$9,000 (\$4,500 has been paid up front).
- Toilets in the Fellowship Hall have been repaired and clean up completed from broken valves.
- New sign (cross) has been installed on the Fellowship Hall outside wall, facing Corsicana.
- A liaison is needed for the ARK. If you are interested, please contact Kara Davis or Claire Grant.
- A presentation on the Hope Springs Water Well will be given at the April Family Night Supper.
- Communion and Offering will remain the same and will be revisited in several months, to see if we feel that we can resume passing Communion and the Offering.
- Easter Lilies will be ordered as soon as we find out price and availability.
- The Worship Committee approved purchasing new choir robes after a total price is calculated.
- Ash Wednesday Service, Maundy Thursday Service, and Good Friday Service will be held at 6:00 p.m.
- Both the 8:30 and 11:00 services on Easter, will be held in the sanctuary.
- There will be Holy Week services as in years past. More information will be available as soon as the ministers meet to discuss details.

For many centuries, cemeteries were commonly found in churchyards, allowing churches to minister to the spiritual needs of their members. But there is a modern alternative which churches are offering their members: the Columbarium.

A Columbarium is a collection of niches designed to house urns inscribed with the person's names and dates of birth and death.

The principal benefit a Columbarium affords church members and their families is the opportunity to select their final resting place in the shadow of the church where their loved ones can visit and meditate at any time.

The Columbarium is part of First Presbyterian Church and functions under the authority of the Session. A Columbarium Committee oversees operation of the Columbarium.


















ONE GREAT HOUR OF SHARING


