

Maybe a relationship with another person. There's nothing wrong with working toward these things – unless you're thinking that achieving them will satisfy you. The fact is none of these things can ever provide lasting satisfaction.


Twelve plus years ago, as I was preparing to move to Athens, I was cleaning out some files and came across an old folder that contained a list of specific goals I had made for myself as I began pastoring my first congregation back in 1975. I tried to answer questions like: What did I want to accomplish with the congregation? What size congregation did I want to be pastoring in 10 years? In which direction did I want my ministry to go? As I looked over those goals, I realized I had obtained every goal on the list. I was overwhelmed by two emotions. One was gratitude to God for allowing me to achieve those goals. And second, I was overwhelmed that I wasn't more satisfied.

I wasn't focused on the things I already had, but rather on people who had more than I did and people who had done more than I had done. That is why we should never depend on outward circumstances for our inward happiness.

I discovered that contentment is being satisfied with what God has given you, realizing that God has given you everything you need to enjoy life. Enjoy the blessings God has given you, and the people He has placed in your life.

Columbarium News:

For many centuries, cemeteries were commonly found in church yards, allowing churches to minister to the spiritual needs of the members. But there is a modern alternative which churches are offering their members: the Columbarium.

A Columbarium is a collection of niches designed to house urns inscribed with the person's names and dates of birth and death.

The principal benefit a Columbarium affords church members and their families is the opportunity to select their final resting place in the shadow of the church where their loved ones can visit and meditate at any time.

The Columbarium is part of First Presbyterian Church and functions under the authority of the Session.

A Columbarium Committee oversees operation of the Columbarium.

Community Concerns & Missions Committee: **End of Year Report for 2025.**

The Community Concerns and Missions Committee had a very busy and productive year. Several organizations in the Henderson County community and beyond are helped financially through funds distributed by the Programs, Missions & Benevolence Committee. These include Labor of Love, Mo-Ranch, Food Pantry, The Ark, CASA, Family Peace Project, Camp Gilmont, Skiin with the Galilean, Lila Lane Outreach, The Farm, Rainbow Room, Rebecca Project, Love in Action, Matthew 2535, FPC Mothers' Day Out, Henderson County Young Life, TVCC Cardinal Resource HQ and Presbyterian Children Homes and Services.

We have several church members who are involved in local ministries. Here is a recap of 2025.

Agape Quilt Ministry: This ministry, under the leadership of Sofia Yarbrough, produces 30 quilts per month for the homeless community of Henderson County. Other quilters include Sharon Harding, Steve Yarbrough, Ken Lemmon, Cathie Scarborough, Judy Willis, Barbara Kimes, Christy Purser and Jan Richardson. Although the Yarbrough's moved to California in the Fall, the committee continues its ministry.

The Ark: Jolene Taylor is our Ark liaison. She and her team have been very busy, serving lunch to approximately 200 students on four separate occasions. Our church also provided dessert over Thanksgiving to those students who were unable to go home. Ark volunteers in addition to Jolene were Christy Purser, Beth Youngblood, Lou Sutton, Donna Bennett, Ken Lemmon, Anna Fontana and Margaret Edginton.

Beat the Heat: This past May, 40 box fans were purchased by church members and distributed to people in the community to help combat the summer heat.

Christmas Benevolence Program: After many years of dedication, Penny Endsley stepped down as coordinator of the Christmas Benevolence Program. Terri Budow volunteered to head the program and did an amazing job. Fifteen volunteers shopped at Walmart for fifteen families and 54 children. Each family received items for Christmas, a \$150 Brookshires gift card and a bible. Six volunteers shopped for eight angels from Oakwood Nursing Center.

Food Pantry: Several of our members volunteer at the Food Pantry. They are: Mamie Downing, Kim Scott, Kay Moore, Donna Ward, Penny Endsley, Beth Youngblood, Emily Carlson, Claire Grant, Jo Ann Johnson, Barbara & Randy Kimes.

Fuel Fund: The Fuel Fund, which is a non-budgeted item and depends solely on donations, provided assistance to more than 85 families in the Henderson County area. The HELP Center distributes the \$6,000 given annually by our church.

Love in Action: Our church provides a meal to approximately 30 people on the last Friday of every month. This year we had quarterly teams provide the meals, and members of the congregation generously provided the ingredients. Volunteers who helped prepare the meals were: Pam Douglas, Kay Moore, Zan and Charlie Tidmore, Jolene Taylor, Terri Budow, Anna Fontana, Christy Purser and Claire Grant. We also collected snacks to fill bags for people to have for over the weekend.

Missionary Partners: We received an update from our missionary partners in Korea, Kurt Esslinger and Hyeyoung Lee. Their current work has concluded, but they have a new assignment in PC (USA).

Presbyterian Disaster Relief: Our committee sent a donation to First Presbyterian Church of Ruidoso to help those affected by the devastating floods.

Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services (PCHAS): Claire Grant is our liaison to PCHAS. Our church participated in two projects. Several members provided school supplies for ten middle school and high school students in late Summer, and 20 family baskets were filled in December to be distributed to families under the PCHAS umbrella.

Skiin With The Galilean: Several members of our congregation provided cookies for their annual event.

Soup Kitchen: Several church members continue to work tirelessly to provide meals on a takeout basis to people in the Athens community. 160-170 sandwiches are made daily, in addition to soup and desserts. Volunteers are Sharon Harding, Cathie Scarborough, Gary Espy and Kathryn Hendrickson.

Special Offerings: Lou Sutton has headed up our special offerings for many years and is taking a well-earned break. Nancy Perryman has agreed to head up our special offerings beginning in 2026. One Great Hour of Sharing collected \$975, \$390 of which stayed in our community. Our committee voted to donate the funds to the library for summer programs. Pentecost Offering raised \$905. Peace and Global Witness Offering brought in \$550, \$137.50 which we sent to PCHAS. The final special offering, Christmas Joy Offering, received \$605. Thanks to the generous giving of our members, our congregation once again went "Four For Four".




